

INDUSTRIES

During the last more than 50 years there has been substantial growth in industrial sector with industrial units rising from 8160 in 1951 to 129363 in 1998 and employment growing from 17000 to 14.4 during this period . the substantial growth has been due to stable factors like roads , transport, telecommunication and particularly power.

RELOCATION SCHEME

I Present status regarding allotments made, payments received and possession given

Allotments of flatted factories and developed indl plots have been made to 18360 applicants by draw of lots in the newly developed indl area of Bawana and already developed areas at Narela, Badli, Jhilmil and Patparganj. Water polluting industries were given allotments on priority basis in Narela and Badli while units falling under 'F' category of Master Plan of Delhi were given priority allotments in Bawana Indl Area. Details are given below:

DDA was requested to identify additional land for development of new industrial areas for relocating the remaining eligible applicants.

In addition, about 1000acres of land has been identified and notified under section 4& 6 of land Acquisition Act for development in to Industrial Estate .

1. **Direction and Administration [Rs.20.00 lakh]**

Industries Department is presently dealing with the relocation of Industries from non-conforming/ residential areas to conforming areas and also dealing with the project DSIDC has completed the construction of the 10 CETPs. Out of 10 CETPs, 08 CETPs after the trial run have been handed over to respective CETPs Society for their operation and maintenance & remaining 2 CETPs are expected to be handed over soon. In view of the facts mentioned above a proposal for creation of posts as referred to above will be processed during the year 2008-09. A provision of Rs. 20.00 lakh is approved for the year 2008-09 for this scheme .

2. **Quality Marking Scheme for Domestic Electrical Appliances (Rs. 3.00 Lakhs)**

Household Electrical Appliances are being manufactured in the country mostly in small scale sector, to improve the Quality of these Electrical Appliances/Items, The Principle objective of the Quality Marking Scheme is to ensure safety and full protection to the consumers of electrical appliances as well as to ensure the effective implementation of the various provisions of the following Quality Control Orders. The Department of Industries, Govt. of Delhi, is Nodal Agency to implement the above said orders in N.C.T. of Delhi. In view of this Quality Control Laboratory (Electrical) has been established at Leather Flatted Factories Complex, Wazirpur, Delhi, providing the requisite testing facilities to the manufacturers of electrical appliances. The Department has issued 2652 Manufacturer's Certificates under Quality Control Order, 1981 in NCT of Delhi since October, 1983. Government of Delhi has set up its own Testing Laboratory at Wazirpur Leather Flatted Factory Complex and sample of various units are being tested in this Lab on the rates being charged by Regional Testing Center, Government of India. The process of accreditation of the Lab from National Accreditation Board of Laboratories, Govt. of India is under process. Funds are required for the purpose of annual maintenance contracts, calibrations of testing equipments and repair of testing equipments, Computers and other necessary items used for day to day functioning of the laboratory, publicity of various Quality Control Orders, purchase of various technical journals, magazines, Indian Standard Specifications, daily consumables, raw materials, payments of fees for application for BIS Certification and NABL accreditation etc.

An outlay of Rs.3.00 lakh is approved for 2008-09.

3. **Grant in Aid for industrial Pollution Control (Rs.80.00 lakh)**

Construction of following 10 CETPs have been completed & after their trial run successfully, these were finally handed over to the respective CETP`s society for their operation and maintenance:

Two CETPs at Naraina and Najafgarh are under construction at a very slow pace because of paucity of funds as reported by DSIDC. Construction of following three CETPs have been kept in abeyance as per the direction of EPCA.

Regarding costing aspect of CETPs, the initial estimate for the construction of these 15 CETP was Rs. 90 cr. as prepared by NEERI. This estimate did not include the cost of 3 components viz land, conveyance system and HT Lines and also the cost of other essential items required as per detailed engineering. The cost of these three components worked out to be Rs. 70 crores and the revised estimate of 15 CETPs worked out by DSIDC comes to Rs. 256 crores (which also includes the cost of 3 components of Rs. 70 crores). Out of that the entire cost of 3 components (Rs. 70 crores) is required to be paid by Delhi Government i.e. by the Industries Department in addition to its own share of contribution of cost apportionment @ 25% of the estimated cost of 15 CETPs (25% of 186 crores = 46.50 crores). Thus, the total financial liability comes out on the part of Delhi Government is Rs. 116.15 crores which is finally to be approved by EPCA. Delhi Government has already paid an amount of Rs. 87.77 crores to DSIDC & balance amount to the tune of Rs. 28.38 crores is pending till its final decision by EPCA.

The costing issue of 15 CETPs and the pending amount not paid by the society toward their cost apportionment and amount to be paid by Govt. of India of their share contribution etc. has now been entrusted to EPCA vide Hon'ble Supreme Court order dated : 02-02-06. An outlay of Rs.80 lakh is approved for this scheme for 2008-09.

4. Grant-In-Aid to Society for Self Employment (Rs.55.00 Lakhs) :

The Society for self Employment is registered Society established in the year 1986. The aims and object of the society are to give training to the young Generation of weaker section of the Society so that they may earn their livelihood by getting themselves Self Employed or get gainful employment.

The Society for self Employment has fixed a target of training to 550 candidates in different trades during the year 2008-09. It has also been decided to start new training programme in the trade of "Repair and Maintenance of Mobile phone/Cell phone" very shortly. Rs.55.00 lakh is approved for the year 2008-09 .

5. Delhi Institute of Tool Engineering (Rs.430.00 lakhs) :

1. With the amalgamation of Tool Room & training Center (TRTC) and High-Tech vocational Training Center, The Delhi Institute of Tool Engineering (DITE)has come into existence w.e.f. 28-11-2007 .The activities which were being carried out by TRTC and HTVTC ,briefly given below ,are now being carried out by DITE .
2. The Societies of Tool Room & training center (TRTC),Wazirpur Industrial Area ,Delhi and Hi-Tech Vocational (HTVTC) at Okhla Industrial Area ,New Delhi have been amalgamated in consultation with the department of Law and Finance ,Govt. of NCT of Delhi and the amalgamated Society has been renamed as Delhi Institute Tool Engineering (DITE) .The amalgamation has been done with the approval of Hon'ble Lt.Governor ,Delhi. Necessary amendments in the Registration Certificate, under Societies registration Act, 1860, has also been got done from the office of the register (Firms & Societies), Government of NCT of Delhi .The Delhi Institute of Tool Engineering has come into existence w.e.f. 28th ,Novembar ,2007 and is functioning from Wazirpur and Okhla Area .

The Training courses ,manufacturing of Tools ,undertaking of Jobs work and other related activities which were being carried out by the TRTC and HTVTC are now being carried out in the name of Delhi Institute of Tool Engineering .

3. The services of an export agency viz. M/S Educational Consultants India Limited (Ed.CIL) ,a Govt . of India Undertaking ,have been engaged for preparation of a detailed a detailed Project (DPR)for Degree level Course in Tool Engineering which is proposed to started in the Delhi Institute of Tool Engineering .
4. The Delhi Institute of Tool Engineering has already submitted an application to all Indian Council for Technical Education (AICTE) for seeking their approval for starting degree level course in Tool Engineering and to Guru Govind Singh Indraprastha University (GGSIPU) for affiliation of the said Course.

5. Upgradation, Improvement & Handing over of Civic Services of Industrial Estate/Flatted Factory Complexes. (Rs. 60.00 lakh)

With this view there are various industrial estates in Delhi under Industries Department for which special provisions are made in annual plan as well as in five-year plan. As regards the base paper for 11th five year plan for the Land Branch is concerned, the emphasis of the department would be on the following point:-

There is a growing need to curtail the expenditure on the over all maintenance and upkeep of the industrial estates as well surroundings for which the department is seriously considering the involvement of the industries/allottees with the signing of MOUs at available space for plantation would be considered so that the feelings of participation under the Bhagidari System would be grown up. To organize seminars/conference alongwith technical experts so that the industrial sector may become more competitive, in the changed scenario of increasing competition from south East Asian countries especially China, and also due to the restrictions of polluting industries in Delhi.

As regards the civic amenities are concerned, the department would interact with the government agencies such as DISCOMS, DJB, MCD and others for proper cleanliness and for observing the continuance supply of water as well as electricity. It has been also found that the maintenance of roads etc. is not being properly carried out by the agency to whom the responsibility has been bestowed upon. Therefore the Delhi Government has decided to take up all such maintenance work under Bhagidari with the allottees restricting to those areas, which have not been handed over to Municipal Corporation of Delhi for maintenance purpose. Such industrial areas are nine in Delhi.

The Delhi Govt. has approved a scheme under this Plan Scheme to provide financial support to industrial areas on the pattern of Bhagidari:

The works are to be executed by any Govt. agency like Delhi Industrial Development Corporation, Delhi Jal Board, Public Works Department, Delhi

Tourism Development Corporation etc. Under the scheme 15% of the estimated cost has to be paid by the respective industrial estate association (where works are to be

executed) and 85% will be funded by the Delhi Govt. through Industries Department under this plan scheme. The amount will be released to the respective executing agency.

6. Scheme for Upgradation /Improvement of Civic Infrastructure in the Industrial Estates of Delhi (Rs. 1001.00 Lakh)

With a view to provide basic civic infrastructure in the industrial estates/areas, the Government of NCT of Delhi has formulated a scheme for upgradation/improvement of infrastructure in participation with the industries owners both in terms of financial contribution and also in decision making for such upgradation.

To begin with, the scheme will be confined to the 9 industrial estates/areas:-

a. **Scope of works to cover :**

- (i) road service dressing;
- (ii) horticulture;
- (iii) storm water drain;
- (iv) water tanks;
- (v) water line;
- (vi) public toilets;
- (vii) sewage;
- (viii) disposal of malba;
- (ix) street lights and high mast lights; and
- (x) common facility centre

b. 15% of the total expenditure to be incurred on the selected work shall be borne by the industrial association / society of the area on Bhagidari basis which is to be contributed before the work is allotted to the implementing agency.

c. The industrial association/society of the area shall prioritise the work to be undertaken through the Land Management Agency and have the estimates prepared. Funds would be released in three installments, namely: -

- 40% on allocation of work (this would include 15% contribution by the industrial association/society;
- 30% on award of the work to the contractor; and
- 30% on completion of 70% of the work

d. 85% of the total cost of the work shall be met out of the plan scheme of upgradation /improvement of civic services of industrial estates and 15% of the total cost shall be borne by the industrial Association of the area / Federation of Association/Society of the industrial estates/areas.

- e. In all/any of the industrial estates which have / has more than one industrial association, they should form a federation of the associations for identification and prioritization of upgradation work to be undertaken;
- f. 'Memorandum of Understanding' would be entered into with Department of Industries with each association/society, providing for post-upgradation/maintenance for each work.
- g. Associations of the Industrial Estate may explore feasible establishment for public/private partnership projects for up gradation of the industrial estate so that maintenance may be taken care on sustainable basis through levy of user fee. Rs. 106.00 lakhs is approved for this Scheme for the year 2008-09 . This includes Rs.60.00 lakh to be spent by PWD and the remaining by Industries Department.

7. **Udyog Sadan (Rs.28.00 Lakhs)**

The building of Industries Department has already been constructed named as "Udyog Sadan "at 419,FIE,Patparganj Delhi 92 , wherein three more offices namely ,Delhi State Industrial and Infrastructure Development Corporation Ltd ,(DSIIDC),Delhi Khadi and Village Industries Board(DKVIB) and Pay & Accounts office No.XVII and XXIV have also been housed and have already been started functioning which is helping Industrial Entrepreneurs to get their problems addressed under one roof. Total cost of the Building including furniture etc .is estimated to be Rs 2590.00 lakhs approximately .Out of these Rs 24,00,63,569 /has already been released to Delhi State Industrial Development Corporation .

In order to provide more facilities under one roof an Industrial branch of State Bank of India (SBI) has also started recently along with latest modern technology and also with the facility of ATM at Udyog Sadan.

There is also a proposal for construction of two additional floors (5&6floor) at existing A&B Block of Udyog Sadan building. For this purpose process of getting approval from Finance Department (as EFC approval) is in progress.

EFC approval of Rs 281 lakh for centralized Air conditioning system in the office of CI, DKVIB and Auditorium has already been obtained and Rs.159 Lakhs has already been released to DSIIDC for starting the work and balance amount of Rs.182 Lakhs will be released to DSIIDC after receiving the status report in the respect of of previous sanctioned amount of Rs 159 Lakhs. Rs 28.00 lakhs is proposed for this Scheme for 2008-09 .

8. **Promotion, Marketing, Exhibition and Publicity (Rs.90.00 lakh)**

A. **General Activities :**

Under this scheme, the Govt. of Delhi organizes Trade Fairs and Exhibitions, besides, publicity of the entire Department is made and the expenditure is booked under this scheme. Basically, the major component of the outlay is spent on participating

in India International Trade Fair at Pragati Maidan which is held every year from 14th to 27th November. In this Fair, for the last over 20 years the Government has been requesting the Delhi State Industrial Development Corporation to participate on behalf of the Govt. of Delhi. A portion of the expenditure made by the DSIIDC in participating in these Trade Fairs minus the income earned by the DSIDC from the participating units is reimbursed to the DSIIDC. The expenditure towards the International Trade Fair is booked under this scheme.

The department decided that Industries Deptt. should also organize 2-3 Handloom/Handicraft Bazars in Delhi. This is being done with a view to popularize the handlooms & handicrafts items manufactured by the handicraft artisans and handloom weavers in Delhi. The basic objective is to provide selling outlets to this economically backward class of artisans and weavers to eliminate middlemen profiteering. This also helps to expose craft persons and weavers to the customers directly. These artisans can study the requirements of the customers and also plan their future production accordingly. It is propose to organise one or two Handlooms & Handicrafts Bazars every year for a period of 10-15 days. The expenditure on account of the Handloom & Handicraft Bazar is booked under this scheme.

For all the above exhibitions, wide publicity is made through advertisements in the newspapers etc. Besides, a number of advertisements are issued by different Sections/Branches of the Industries Department. Entire expenditure incurred towards publicity by the Department is booked under this scheme. It may be mentioned that Delhi Pavilion at Pragati Maidan belongs to Govt. of Delhi. Industries Department is required to pay Property Tax to MCD/ground rent to India Trade Promotion Organisation, Pragati Maidan which are also being met from this scheme.

B. International Activities

PARTICIPATION IN INTERNATIONAL TRADE FAIRS AND EXHIBITIONS

As a result of liberalisation and globalisation of the world economy, trade among countries has shown a significant rate of growth. These relations are required to be fostered for promoting the interests of our exporters and ensuring that our presence in foreign markets is not only maintained but also promoted ITPO and other organisation like CII etc. organise exhibitions and trade fairs in foreign countries at regular intervals. Participation charges including the rental, cost of travel to foreign country and accommodation, however, are quite burdensome to the small entrepreneurs that function in Delhi. To encourage the small scale industries of Delhi to participate in such trade fairs and exhibitions, the department proposes to give subsidy to them for participation

Some kind of assistance may also be provided for taking trade delegations and study teams. The assistance can be provided either through DSIDC or by the Deptt. of Industries directly.

A portion of assistance may also be provided through DSIDC for establishing Warehousing and Trade Centers in foreign countries.

An outlay of Rs.90.00 lakh is approved for 2008-09 for this scheme.

HANDLOOM INDUSTRY

9. Promotin of Handlooms (Rs. 111.50 lakh)

Under the scheme of promotion of handlooms, the following programs are being implemented:-

- A. Financial Assistance to Delhi sponsored candidates getting training at Indian Institute of Handloom Technology.
- B. Integrated Handlooms Development scheme [IHDS]
- C. Financial Assistance to the Handloom Organisations
- D. Strengthening of Handloom Organisations
- E. Assistance for Innovative Ideas & Publicity, Monitoring, Supervision, Training and Evaluation of Scheme
- F. Rebate on Sale of Handloom Cloth
- G. Handloom Weavers Welfare Scheme
- H. New Insurance Scheme for Handloom workers in the Co-operative Societies
 - i. Thrift Fund-cum-Saving Security S
 - ii. Health Insurance Scheme (HIS)

iii. Mahatama Gandhi Bunkar Bima Yojana (MGBBY)

I. Upgradation, Improvement and Handing over of Civic services of Handloom complexes

Following two weaver colonies are covered under this scheme:-

a. Weavers Colony at Bharat Nagar

Department of Industries has set up a Weavers Colony at Bharat Nagar in 1976 on an area of 4.84 acres of land where 28 work sheds were got constructed out of which 20 sheds were allotted to 21 selected primary cooperative societies and Cooperative Bank and 8 work sheds to the Govt. of India for running Weavers Service Centre for the benefit of handloom weavers.

b. **Weavers Colony at Nand Nagri**

Department of Industries has also set up a Weavers Colony at Nand Nagri in 1983 on an area of 2.6 acres of land where 8 work sheds were got constructed out of which 5½ sheds were allotted to primary handloom cooperative societies and ½ Shed to Office, ½ shed to Delhi State Cooperative Bank, 1½ sheds to Society for Self Employment.

An outlay of Rs.111.50 lakh is approved for 2008-09 for the above mentioned activities/ programmes.

10. Promotion of Handicrafts (Rs.10 lakh)

With a view to preserve the traditional heritage of handicrafts, various Apprenticeship Training Schemes (ATS) are being implemented by the Department of Industries in accordance with the pattern of the Govt. of India in various traditional crafts like Metal Crafts, Blue Art Pottery, Artificial Jewellery, Clay Modeling, Beads Work, Miniature Painting, Madhubani Painting, Patchitra, Kashmiri Chiken Works, Zari Zardozi, Marble Sculpture, Wooden Inlay/Wood Carving etc., under the expert guidance of Master Craft Persons of typically National and State Awardees and Craft Persons registered with the O/o Development Commissioner for Handicraft and Industries Department.

As per the pattern, each Master Crafts person is being paid wages @ Rs .2000/- per month, lump-sum payment of Rs. 6000/- per course to Master Craft person for general alteration/ modification of training premises, water and electricity charges etc. Lump Sum amount of Rs.500/- per trainee per course to Master Crafts Person as compensation for wastage of raw material used during the training period and each trainee enrolled under the ATS is being paid the stipend @ of Rs. 300/- per month for the duration of the Course. The duration of the ATS ranges from 6 months to 12 months depending upon the intricacy of the crafts.

Further, in addition to these above Apprenticeship Training Schemes, the Deptt is also running a Carpet Weaving Training Centre (intake capacity 30 students both boys and girls) with one year duration and a Paper Craft and Paper Mache Centre (intake capacity 30 students exclusively for girls) with two years duration at Weaver's Colony, Bharat Nagar Delhi. The trainees in these centers are also being paid stipend at the rate of Rs. 400 per month per trainee.

The required training materials as per the requirement of each centre are being purchased from time to time to run these centers by the Department.

11. Assistance to Women Entrepreneurs to Women Entrepreneurs, Women Welfare Scheme for Self Employment [Rs.10.00 Lakh]

This is an on going scheme. It is proposed to continue the scheme for providing assistance to women entrepreneurs for setting up the tiny industries in National Capital Territory of Delhi.

Women under age group of 18 to 45 years with minimum qualification of 8th pass would be eligible. Those who have acquired skills in a particular trade by way of inheritance and who have developed skills in a particular trade by way of education, professional qualification etc. would be given preference.

Special preference is given to women from SC/ST. Weaker sections, widows specially war widows and divorcees. Reservation upto 22.5% is kept for SC/ST women. The upper age limit for giving assistance in such cases shall be 45 years.

It is proposed to give financial assistance upto Rs. 50,000/- for fixed capital as well as working capital, 25% of which shall be grant in case of disadvantaged category like widows/ divorcees/ physically handicapped/ OBC/SC/ST. In case of the candidates belonging to the General Category, the grant shall be 15% and the rest shall be provided in the form of loan at the prevailing rate of interest and panel rate of interest as decided by the Govt. from time to time. Repayment of loan will have to be completed within five years. A grace period of one year will be given after which the repayment will become due.

Identification of beneficiaries shall be done through open advertisements and selection would be done by Committee comprising of Officers of the Department of Industries; Finance Department; representatives of SISI, Govt. of India; representatives of SC/ST Department. All the applicants would have to produce NOC from High Power Committee for setting up of tiny units of Household category of Industries at the time of selection. Before releasing the loan, the beneficiaries would have to sign loan agreement along with two sureties of responsible persons (Either Income Tax payee or Govt. Servant) and on the production of No Objection Certificate from the High Power Committee by the applicants.

A plan outlay for Rs. 10.00 lakhs have been proposed in the RE for 2007-2008 and equal amount in the BE for 2008-09 as per break up given below.

12. Grant-in-Aid (Proposed allocation Rs.170.00 lakh)

The Board is getting 100% Grant-in-Aid from Govt. of Delhi to meet all its Admn. & Estt. Expenditure. It has no other source of income of its own and all the establishment expenditure is being meet from Grant-in-Aid. Due to increase in Dearness Allowance, Increments and other overheads etc. the allocation under this head during the year 2008-09 is approved to the tune of Rs.170.00 lakh under Revenue Head.

13. Organisation of Exhibitions (Proposed allocation Rs.10.00 lakh)

To promote sale of khadi & village industries products and to make them easy available at door steps of the consumers specially during rebate period the Board proposes to organize exhibitions at various strategic locations of Delhi during the year 2008-09. The duration of these exhibitions will be seven to ten days and these will be conducted between 2nd October 2008 to March 2009. Hence, allocation of Rs.10.00 lakh is approved under revenue head in Annual Plan 2008-09.

14. Publicity & Propaganda (Rs.30.00 Lakhs)

Board has been given responsibility of Implementing a new Scheme for Employment generation from the year 2007-08 .Intensive Publicity of this Scheme is to be undertaken to make people aware about the Scheme . Special Advertisement are to be released in print media on special occasions like Independence day & 2nd October each year . In addition to this ,KVIC is also allocating fund each year under joint publicity with the condition of matching share from State Govt .Hence in order to get allocated fund from KVIC under Joint Publicity and for other publicity programme ,an amount of Rs 30.00 lakh is approved under revenue head for Publicity & Propaganda in Annual Plan 2008-09 .

15. Opening of Khadi Bhawan /Shops (Rs 1.00 Lakhs)

A token provision of Rs.1.00 lakh is kept under loan for opening of shops.

16. Rebate on Sale of Khadi (Rs.200.00 Lakhs)

This rebate is granted to Registered Khadi Institutions on sale of Khadi products by them in NCT of delhi .This rebate is in addition to the rebate being provided by KVIC, Govt .of India . An outlay of Rs.130.50.00 lakh is approved for this scheme for 2008-09.

17. Rajiv Gandhi Swavlamban Rozgar Yojna (Rs.130.50 lakhs)

This loan scheme has been approved by Govt. of Delhi to be implemented by the Board from the year 2004-05. However, as per decision taken in the Plan Review Meeting held on 08 March 2007 under the Chairmanship of Hon;ble Chief Minister, Delhi this scheme is to be merged with the scheme "Self Employment for Education Unemployed Youth" and modified in such a way as to make it more attractive and useful. The proposal has also been approved by the Planning Deptt,in the evolution study of the Rajiv Gandhi Swavlamban Rozgar Yojna circulated by letter No.F.4(2)/9/2006-07/Plg.(EvI)/8037 dated 19.11.2007. Accordingly suitable amendments have been made in the scheme & the same is being sent to the Govt. of NCT of Delhi for approval. Hence an allocation of Rs.130.50 lakh under Loan Head is proposed for this scheme during the year 2008-09.
